
REMEMBERING THE SHRINE'S 175TH YEAR

Looking Back on A Momentous Day

Last October 27th was a day to remember as roughly 500 souls came to the Shrine's 175th anniversary Mass of Celebration followed in the afternoon with a memorable banquet attended by 400.

The Choir of the Shrine of St. Joseph was augmented by violin, oboe, brass quintet, and timpani. Many of the instrumentalists are also members of the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra. It was a special honor to be joined by guest violinist, Kathleen Scarborough, daughter of Ted and Phyllis Wofford. The Choral Prelude included the Bach / Gounod setting of Ave Maria for Choir, Piano and Violin, followed by an elaborate and impressive fanfare from the brass, timpani, and organ preceding the well-chosen processional hymn: "*Hail St. Joseph, Pure and Gentle*", arranged for the celebration.

It was a triumphant occasion for the Shrine as St. Louis Archbishop Robert Carlson, the Main Celebrant, along with Father Dale Wunderlich, Shrine Rector for the last eleven years, and several invited seminarians, processed up the 150 foot long



aisle in between the always colorful Knights of Columbus Honor Guard to the sanctuary of the Shrine's magnificent and glorious 60 foot high completely restored Altar of Answered Prayers.

There was a certain nostalgia as well as joy in experiencing this scene when one recalls the sheer effort it took to not only save this Shrine from being torn down but also to restore it and bring it back to life. This jubilant occasion for those who have worked and volunteered was not just about the 175 years, but also about the pride they possessed in contributing toward seeing this Shrine, in all its magnificence, on this day after nearly 40 years of painstaking effort through the contributions of many donors and volunteers under the direction of the Friends, Inc.

As the Archbishop commented: "we realize that the man, St. Joseph, was ordinary, but he was holy...and he had confident hope...just like all of the folks who have worked to take care of the Shrine and are now able to see the result of their efforts as we sit here in this holy splendor."

Indeed, surely the founders of our organization back in 1979 who are now deceased, who worked hard and sacrificed much, were with us in spirit in the 175th year, and applauding everyone -- donors and volunteers alike -- who, through the years, came together to contribute in making this massive effort a success.





SHRINE'S 175TH BANQUET A GALA EVENT

Following the Jubilee Mass, a banquet attended by nearly 400, was held one and a half miles south of the Shrine at The Cedars Banquet Center. Volunteers arrived at The Cedars early on Sunday to beautifully decorate in splendid fashion the 40 tables. Kathleen and Mike Weltzin used their well-known and much appreciated God-given creativity to design and construct very unique center pieces for each table. The centerpieces honored St. Joseph. St. Joseph, the carpenter, was symbolized by oak tree limbs and white lilies; two lighted votive candles were hanging on the oak limbs for those who have gone before us and for those still living to follow. This visual aura of these lit centerpieces at every table in the ballroom was an impressive sight to behold.



Two special commendations were also given one to Ted Wofford and one to Eldon Arteaga. Ted Wofford orchestrated the entire magnificent Shrine restoration beginning in 1974 and he continues to this day to oversee the conservation

Everyone at the banquet received a commemorative medallion and a 70- page color booklet detailing the history of the Shrine to take with them.



THE BEAUTY OF THE SHRINE'S 175TH CHRISTMAS



A couple of weeks before Christmas, a large group of volunteers decorated the Shrine with at least 25 lit Christmas trees, garland, poinsettias, and a large nativity scene. The entire result by the end of the day was a stunning presentation dedicated to our Lord's birth. One comment made by a regular worshiper to a first-timer before entering the Shrine on Christmas Eve was: "When you come inside here, you'll see what the entrance to heaven looks like."

On the secular side, about a week prior to Christmas in the seasonally decorated rectory was a visit by Board member, Jim Fuller, as Santa Claus. After Mass, about 25 youngsters got to visit Santa, who was, for these kids and their parents, an absolute total "class act."



The culmination of the Shrine's 175th year,

Christmas could not have been better: with Father Wunderlich, our great and humble priest, our outstanding choir and instrumentalists, along with an impeccably restored and exquisitely decorated church. For the Christmas Eve Mass, over sixteen different carols were sung by our choir along with congregational singing and enhanced by organ, piano, and

a brass ensemble from the St. Louis Symphony. David Byrne, organist and choir director included a few lesser known yet beautiful carols from other countries. With over 550 in attendance it has become a tradition for many of these families to begin their Christmas by attending the Nativity of Our Lord Vigil at the Shrine. "Each Christmas is new," said Father Wunderlich in his homily, "yet it is connecting us to each and every previous Christmas we have known...God is outside of space and time but through the birth of Jesus he became part of our time." Taken together, both Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Masses were attended by well over 750 worshipers to experience the awe-inspiring sacredness, beauty, and nostalgia associated with the Shrine at this blessed time of the year.



THIS WINTER MARKS COMPLETION OF CEILING CONSERVATION

The Board of Directors has approved the final stage of ceiling conservation work. Therefore, scaffolding has once again been erected under the last four ceiling bays above the east side aisles this winter. Every winter since 2012 the ceiling has been gradually restored. This original restoration was accomplished over 25 years ago; this work on the 14 ceiling bays resulted in Wofford and his artisans being honored with a prestigious restoration award by the American Institute of Architects in 1988. In 2012, flaking was discovered in some of the primary colors of the vast areas of painted decoration. After further research, it was decided that, due to the cost of scaffolding, we would also clean and refresh the decorative ornamentation, and, at the same time, correct any water damage and minor plaster work that had occurred prior to the installation of the new slate roof. Temperature and humidity changes encountered throughout these many years can also create problems. This work of refurbishing of the entire Shrine ceiling has been completed over the winter months of these last 9 years. The Board appreciates the patience and understanding of those who regularly attend the Shrine during these times while we do the work necessary to conserve our precious historic church.
